Presidents message

An expat in Holland

By now you have had your Dutch-American heritage day. I am an American in Holland at the moment.... finding heritage in different ways.

The wind is fierce and fall leaves give color to the cloudy sky. The red, purple, brown, yellow and green of the leaves and their many shapes surprise me. I haven't seen them since living in Florida. With its trees and fields, Holland still has a lot of nature, immediately noticeable once driving outside the villages and cities. One cannot miss the results of the 'giving back to nature' movement, looking at the small ditches and rivers. In 1960, the focus was to optimize land for agriculture and straiten land and water. Now rivers can meander and have space to overflow.

The Dutch are very modern, as I experienced by simply going for some groceries to an Albert Hein. Everywhere in the store were scanners, which I needed to use to already calculate my shopping basket as I went along. At the door, the only thing was paying the final amount. I did not find this a completely relaxed shopping event. I guess it is a matter of getting used to it. More new design I saw at the Dutch Design Week in Eindhoven. This is an international event where the Dutch show how well they make a car on solar cells, how they can save water by re-filtering used water, how they make the house cozy and organized by furniture with storage space inside. Dutch Design Week was elegantly hosted with lots of restaurants with exciting food from Europe.

As an expat, I feel familiar with the surroundings. On the other hand I am not up to date with things. Taking a bus or train, I needed to have an OV-card. It is challenging to figure out which train and which price, as 3 different companies are running on the rails. The mail system is now divided amongst 3 companies. They wanted to create a competing free market, however the average Dutch person is skeptical about the service and does not see improvements.

The advertisements we receive at the home we live in, are drenched with English words to make the product 'cool.' However, the discussion about the status of the 'black pieten', the helpers of Sinterklaas is not 'cool.' Still, on December 6, Sinterklaas will visit with his 'zwarte Pieten' as most people do not see any problem with that, and I agree.

Carissa is looking forward to Sinterklaas, who will visit her school. Carissa says the school is 'awesome', especially the no homework part! The rules are less strict than at Tampa Palms Elementary School. They have more playtime, no uniforms, iPads in class, performance afternoons. Carissa is settling in fast, making 'play dates' after school.

Tijdens de viering van het Leids Ontzet op 13 October kwam consul Patrick Willemsen de onderscheiding namens de Majesteit opspelden. Het was een volslagen verrassing voor André die gewoon in korte broek en op sandalen naar de bijeenkomst was gekomen.

Op 22 October stond het verslag van de gebeurtenis in de society rubriek (beter bekend als het Stan Huygens Journaal) van De Telegraaf.



Luchtig lintje in Florida

Meer dan twintig jaar is *André Steijlen* uit het Amerikaanse Tampa in Florida als secretaris de drijvende kracht achter de Holland Club in Tampa Bay geweest. Reden voor koning Willem-Alexander om hem met het lidmaatschap in de orde van Oranje-Nassau te eren.

Tijdens een druk bezochte ledenbijeenkomst werd de 80-jarige Steijlen in het zonnetje gezet. Het was een volslagen verrassing voor de man, die nietsvermoedend in korte broek en op sandalen was komen opdagen.

De Nederlandse consul *Patrick Willemsen* uit Orlando spelde de medaille op het T-shirt van het verblufte oud-bestuurslid, die onlangs zijn functie had neergelegd. Het was voor Willemsen, die nu vier jaar als honorair consul in centraal Florida zit, de eerste keer in zijn carrière

dat hij een koninklijke onderscheiding mocht uitreiken. Het komt maar zelden voor dat een Nederlander in het buitenland een lintje krijgt. „Ik vond het dus een eer om dit te mogen doen”, zei de consul, die zijn vrouw *Judith* had meegenomen.

André Steijlen is van 1992 tot 2013 onafgebroken secretaris van de Nederlandse club geweest. Terwijl vele voorzitters kwamen en gingen, bleef de in Harderwijk geboren secretaris als een rots in de branding op zijn post.
